We are very proud to report to you that even during a pandemic...Ten Lives Club took in the most cats in one year than we ever have before. More than 3,000 cats came into our organization from all over (WNY, Cattaraugus, Erie, Niagara counties, southern kill shelters, Puerto Rico and more). We believe a cat is a cat no matter where they come from. That's why we work so hard to save as many as we possibly can, thanks to you – our amazing supporters and donors – who have helped us save more than 38,000 cats in the past 21 years.

This year has also been filled with many positive changes! We welcomed talented new staff members including our new Director of Shelter Operations, Joseph Sprague. Joseph has 30 years of experience in animal welfare and has worked as the executive director at animal shelters across the nation. We are very excited to have him on board and we know you will love him too!



We've had many inspiring cat rescue stories happening throughout the year. One of our most memorable was helping Jud, a homeless veteran, and a cat named Junior he befriended outside of the shelter he was residing. Jud did not have the money to care for Junior

when he was badly injured by another cat in his colony, so Jud called Ten Lives Club and we were more than happy to assist. Junior, the cat, lived at our shelter for many months until Jud found a place to stay. We are grateful to report that Jud and Junior now live in their own apartment TOGETHER thanks to your support!



Another successful cat rescue mission took place this summer when a hurricane hit Louisiana. Ten Lives Club teamed up with Best Friends Animal Society and other rescues to save cats from kill shelters before and after the hurricane hit. One of our volunteers made a nice room in our warehouse just for them. Many volunteers, our shelter veterinarian, and staff eagerly anticipated their arrival when the Best Friends transport van pulled up to our shelter late at night. The cats were given plenty of love, food, and water and they had air conditioning to keep cool. That warehouse is a blessing to us as we will be turning it into a veterinarian clinic in the very near future.

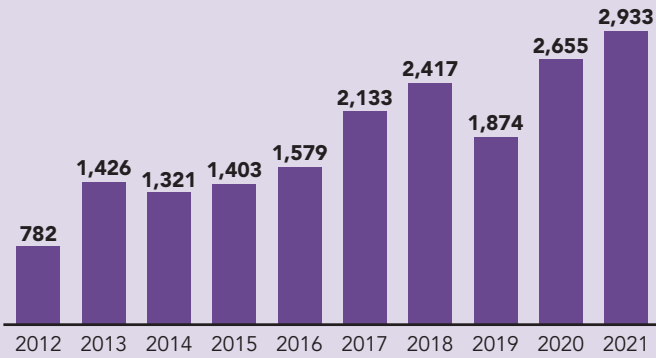

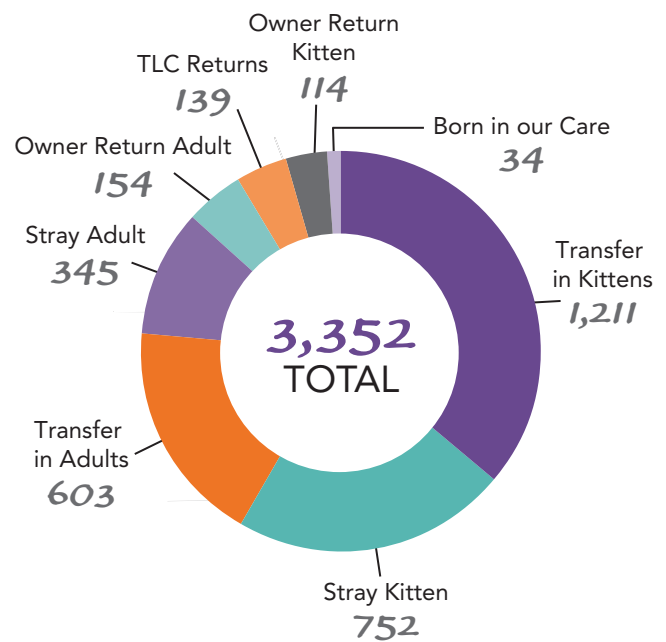

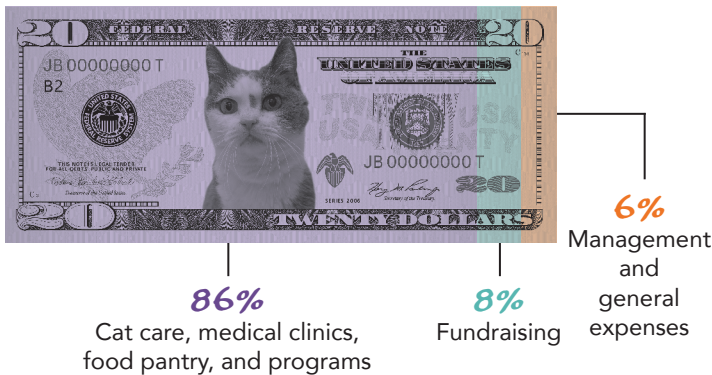
In 2021, Ten Lives Club Pet Food Pantry received **122,404 pounds (61.20 tons)**

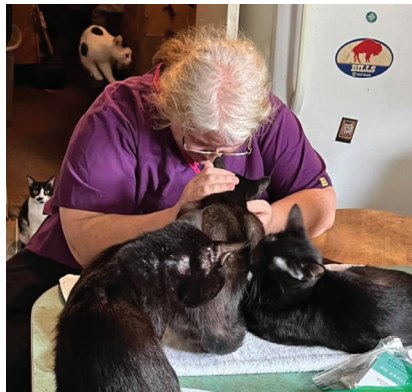
In early October our friends at West Side Cat Sanctuary alerted our rescue to a large group of cats that had been left behind at a home after their owner passed away. The person currently caring for them stated that all the cats originated from a single male cat still in the home. Ten Lives Club knew they had to step in and help.

Our veterinarian Dr. Fisk, vet techs Claudia and Jenille, vet assistant Don, shelter manager Alli, Jamie M., and volunteer Bob physically went to the house and began assessing the cats. This is not our normal procedure. The goal was to vaccinate, worm and flea-med as many as possible, preparing them for relocation. Situations like this have no simple fix.



Upon entry, there were cats lounging all over the kitchen table, counter, stove and chairs. Many more were lying on the bed or hiding in a once walk-in closet. Under Dr Fisk's direction, 17 cats were distemper and rabies vaccinated, wormed, given flea medication, micro-chipped and velcro-collared. Three young kittens and a young adult cat with severe hair loss were brought back to the shelter for treatment. This effort was just a start and it was going to take a village to get these cats relocated. Time was ticking and the cats needed to be

moved. West Side Cat Sanctuary paid for the spay/neuter costs for all of the felines and we worked together with the rescue community to find the cats their forever homes.



Planets aligned to save Mercury

Mercury had a hard life until he came into the Ten Lives Club program. At just a couple weeks old, Mercury and his seven siblings were found on the side of the road after a car threw all eight kittens out of it, aiming for a road sign. All the kittens did hit the road sign which devastatingly killed seven of them. Mercury was the lone survivor.



Because of cat lovers like you, Mercury got the happily ever after he deserved. He was placed into an experienced bottle feeding foster home where he was able to grow and recover from the trauma. After being nursed back to health, Mercury's foster mom fell in love with him and officially adopted him.



Copperfield, the kitten, thought she'd never find a home



Copperfield came to Ten Lives Club scared. At only four months old, she didn't understand why she was in a shelter right before Christmas. Fortunately she didn't have to wonder for too long.

A wonderful family came to our shelter on Christmas Eve. They were looking for a companion for their grandmother who had owned cats her whole life and was devastated when hers passed away. The moment the family saw sweet Copperfield in her cage, they knew she was the one.

Copperfield stayed with the family until they were ready to give her to grandma on Christmas morning. Grandma couldn't believe her eyes when the adorable little ball of fur was placed on her lap. It was love at first sight.

Copperfield didn't leave grandma's side. It's almost as if she knew she was home. They stayed on the couch together, cuddling all day.

Copperfield was one of many cats who received their Christmas wish of finding their forever home. We hope to make more dreams come true for kittens like Copperfield.



Foster care program

Not every animal that comes to TLC is ready for adoption. Some need to grow, others need to recover from sickness or illness. Nearly **160 dedicated foster volunteers** provided the loving and nurturing care needed to prepare these cat and kittens for their new families.

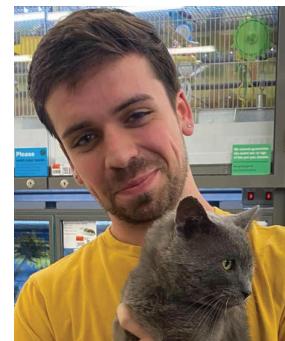

Ten Lives Club at the Eastern Hills Mall reached a milestone of 3,000 adoptions on Thursday, December 2nd! TLC opened the Eastern Hills Mall location in June of 2017 after the Erie County SPCA moved to their West Seneca location. TLC only had a few free roamers and very few volunteers. Now they are our number one adoption center!

We are so excited for our wonderful staff and volunteers there who make this possible! We would not be able to adopt out the amount of cats that we do each year without our locations across WNY and the incredible people who give these beautiful animals loving homes!

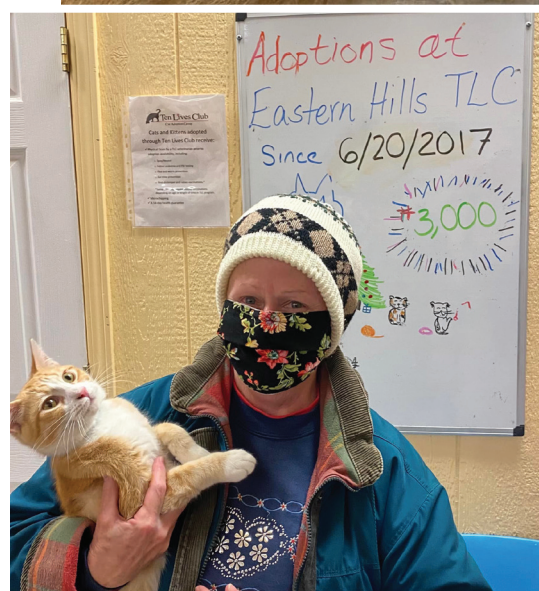
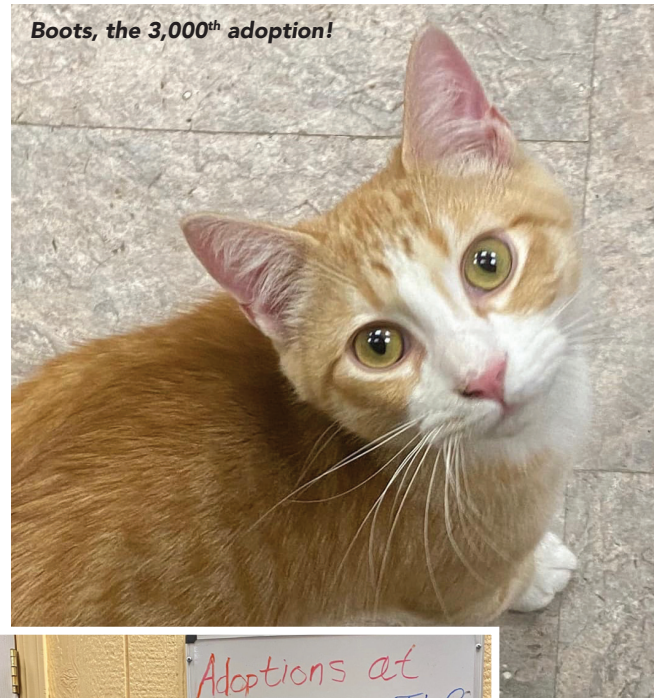

Ten Lives Club invests in an in-house blood machine



Barry, a 2-year-old orange tabby cat, was found on the streets of Cheektowaga. He started experiencing a wealth of health troubles post adoption. The usual remedies for GI upset and diarrhea were not working, so we gave Barry an exam and a blood sample was drawn to see what might be wrong.

While we may never know how Barry contracted haemobartonella, identifying the regenerative anemia using the IDEXX machine allowed him to start the treatment that saved his life. Barry is now recovered and doing well in his new home with longtime volunteer, Joanne Daniels, who adopted him. Thanks to the generosity of Ten Lives Club supporters, the veterinary staff is able to practice a higher quality of medicine for its rescued cats. Time is of the essence when it comes to saving cats and now we are able to receive blood results in 30 minutes – a privilege that saved Barry’s life.

Thankfully our new IDEXX blood analyzer machine was just set up and being demonstrated. Barry’s blood was the first sample to be checked in our shelter.

Barry was severely anemic (low red cell count). Further testing revealed that he had feline infectious anemia, a life-threatening condition caused by the blood parasite mycoplasma haemofelis. This parasite is often spread by blood-sucking mosquitoes, fleas and ticks.



Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV)

A sadly known fact is that many animal shelters euthanize FIV+ cats and kittens that enter their doors. That’s why for the past 21 years, Ten Lives Club has provided a safe haven for FIV+ cats until a proper home is found for them. We consistently receive transfers of FIV+ cats from local and out of state shelters where adoption programs do not exist for these cats. In 2021, TLC has made another big change when it comes to our FIV+ cats as we are now housing them within our regular cat population as they are no threat to the other cats. This makes life for these sweet and innocent cats even better.

The cost of care for the cats surrendered to Ten Lives Club can range from hundreds to thousands of dollars. Your continued support ensures these deserving cats get the care they need for a chance at a happy healthy life. Vet care is provided by two part-time veterinarians, three vet technicians and two vet assistants.

In 2021, TLC hosted **97** public Spay/Neuter Clinics that provided **588** cats and kittens with spay/neuter surgery, vaccinations and other medical services. These clinics were open to both personally-owned pets, and cats from other area rescues.

Priscilla's tenth life



Priscilla was at death's door when you helped Ten Lives Club save her life this past September. Priscilla, a beautiful Siamese cat, was found on the streets of Buffalo's west side – barely conscious, unable to walk, at the mercy of whoever crossed her path. The kind woman who found her knew that Priscilla deserved a chance. Her story wouldn't end there. Not like that.

Ten Lives Club helped Priscilla when no one else could. Our weekly spay/neuter clinic turned into an "all hands on deck" life-saving effort. Priscilla had been trying to deliver kittens for days; kittens who had already crossed the rainbow bridge. She was in septic shock. With a final push, this brave, tired mama's heart stopped and she was clinically dead. But her story didn't end there either.

The Good Samaritan who rushed Priscilla to Ten Lives Club, and our vet staff who worked on her for hours, weren't the only heroes that fateful day.

You were.

Heart compressions. Breathing machine. Emergency drugs. Oxygen tube. A shot of epinephrine directly into the heart. Extensive emergency surgery. Donors like you saved Priscilla's life. Your generosity allows us to employ two vets in-house and maintain a surgical suite stocked with the medicine and supplies that Priscilla needed.

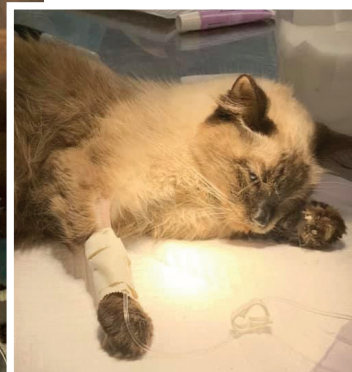
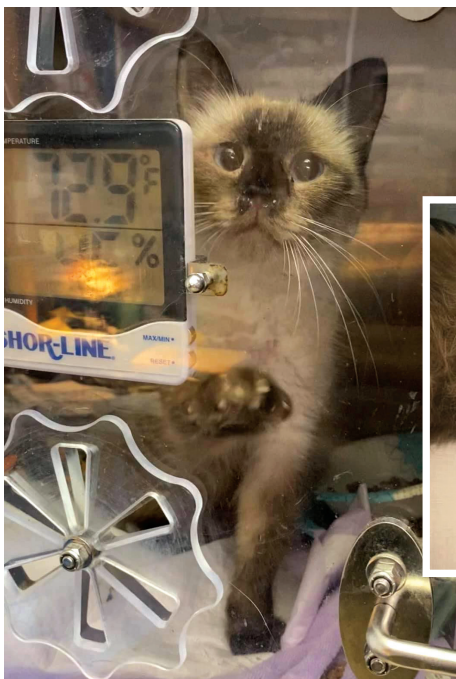

2022 Goals

- Complete the vet office and surgery suite in the warehouse. By completing this space, Ten Lives Club will be able to provide low cost spay/neuter and other minor services to other local rescue groups and personally-owned pets.
- Hold public rabies, distemper, and microchip clinics for pet owners at a reduced price at our medical suite in the warehouse.
- Remodel our main shelter to offer a better adoption center and space to operate in a less confined environment for both the cats and people.
- Create more free-roaming rooms for cats, reducing their stay in cages.
- Increase intake of cats whenever feasible.
- Enhanced education of the importance of spay/neuter to save cats.
- Partner with like-minded organizations and rescues to help cats.
- Installation of Cat Cam in all of our free range cat rooms to be broadcast on our website.
- Launch of our annual magazine, *Good Mousekeeping*.
